ACT Students planning to take the December 12th ACT must register by November 6th. This is probably the last test that can be used for college scholarships.

College Applications

Seniors should be completing applications at this time. Applications should definitely be submitted by Christmas. A transcript must be requested by email or in writing from the guidance office for **each** application.

FAFSA

(Free Application for Federal Student Aid 2011-'12) can be filled out online at **www.fafsa.ed.gov** (preferred method) after the first of the year.

Paper forms can be picked up in the Guidance Office in December. FAFSA should be completed as soon as possible after the first of the year. However, figures from your 2010 Tax Returns are needed on this form. Assistance is available from the financial aid office of any college.

Graduation

Orders were taken for Graduation Announcements. If you do not order before December 1st, the price goes up. Call the Guidance Office if you have questions.

Making a Difference Scholarship

The Making a Difference Foundation is sponsoring two \$1,000 scholarships for graduating seniors. One scholarship will be awarded to a Bishop Brossart High School student and one will be awarded to a Campbell Co. HS student. Applications are available in the guidance office. Applicants must have a GPA of at least 2.70, participate in community service and have clear financial need. Application must be returned **to the guidance office by Nov.11th**.

Fall Wrap-up:

Football: The boys varsity football team qualified for their second straight post season playoff appearance beating Dayton 50-6 on Friday. They will travel next Friday to Frankfort High School in a rematch of last year's playoff appearance. The team is currently 6-3. Our middle school finished with a 5-3 record this year.

Volleyball: Coach Pennie Wiseman's varsity set a new school record with a 25-9 record and beat Campbell Co. to win their first District Championship since 2003. They advanced to Region play before falling to Highlands. They also won their second consecutive 10th Region Touchstone All "A" Championship this year and finished 3rd Place at the State All "A" Championships.

Boys Golf: The boys varsity golf team won the 10th Region Touchstone All "A" Region Championship beating second place Paris. The Mustangs played in the All "A" State Tournament in Richmond September 11. They recently participated in the All "A" Region and KHSAA Regional as well as the NKAC and KHSAA Regional.

Girls Golf: The girls varsity golf team also qualified for the Touchstone All "A" State as 10th Region Champions. The Lady 'Stangs advanced as a team to play in Richmond, Ky. Lauren Seiter was medalist for the girls tournament. They also recently finished play in the NKAC and Regional Tournaments.

Boys Soccer: The boys varsity won the Scott Christian Memorial Tournament this year and recently finished the season with a 12-7-3 record. They lost in the opening round of the 19th District Tournament.

Girls Soccer: The girls varsity team finished the season with an 8-9-4 record with one more win than the previous season. They beat Newport Central Catholic 2-1 to advance to the District Championship match. They eventually fell in the Region Tourney to Notre Dame in overtime.

Girls Cross Country: The varsity girls cross country team is getting some outstanding performances from some of their younger performers and hope to be in the running for a state berth. The team hopes to finish in the top of the upcoming Regional Meet.

Boys Cross Country:

The team is currently ranked 2nd in State Class A.

Senior Zach Holtkamp is ranked 4th individually and recently was crowned the Northern Kentucky Athletic Conference Individual Champion with his win at the meet. The team finished 2nd in the Conference Meet. This is the 5th time this season Zach has won an invitational/meet.

Senior Jack Foster is ranked 8th in State Class A.

Seniors Andy Wolfer, Daniel Powel, and Barrett Kues, Junior Brian Neltner, and Freshman Michael Caldwell and Andrew Kramer continue to contribute to the success of the Varsity Team.

The Regional Meet is on Nov. 6th at Idlewild Park and the State Meet is the following weekend Nov. 13th at the Kentucky Horse Park.

New Coaches: Josh Feldmann will begin this year as the new Head Girl's Basketball Coach. He will bring two new assistant coaches to the program as well, with Sarah Garwood and Jeff Schaefer.
