### Scholarships/Financial Aid –

- If you want help paying for college, you have to be willing to work for it. REGARDLESS OF INCOME, ALL PARENTS/STUDENTS SHOULD APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID BY COMPLETING THE FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). The new forms (2010-'11) will be online at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov) by Nov or Dec .
- Reminder – Check KEES money at [www.kheaa.com](http://www.kheaa.com). You need to apply for a personal ID and password and have your son/daughter's SSN and date of birth to do this.
- Governmental, state and college financial aid are still the most probable ways students will receive financial assistance for college. SCHOLARSHIP AND FINANCIAL AID resources are available for parents and students to look through in our Library. Public libraries and book stores also have many references. Private companies provide a service and charge to do this research for you, but you can get the same information if you have the time to do the work. Check the BBHS website/guidance for more information.
- **For more information on scholarships and financial aid check with the college(s) you have an interest in.**

**Senior Personal Profiles** – Seniors should be filling out a "Personal Profile". Information about post-secondary plans, volunteer & extra-curricular activities, and work experience is required on a number of forms throughout the year. The Profile form can be downloaded from our website, typed and saved. It would be good for you to review this form with your son/daughter.

**Senior Info Nite** – Sunday, Oct 17<sup>th</sup> there will be senior information session from 7 to 8 in Hegenauer Hall. Plan to attend for valuable information regarding college/tech schools, financial aid, scholarships and other important senior year events.

**ACT** - The deadline has passed for the October testing date. However, there are also testing dates on December 11 and February 12. Check [www.act.org](http://www.act.org) for registration information.

**PSAT**- All Juniors and some Sophomores will take PSAT on Oct 14<sup>th</sup> during school. This is another test to check for college readiness. PSAT is also used for the Governors Scholar Program and for National Merit Scholarships. Students should be sure to take their practice booklet home over Fall Break !

**Football:** The boys varsity football team won their second straight Bobcat Bowl Title beating Betsy Layne 34-19 at Betsy Layne to open the season and then have followed that up with big wins over Trimble Co. 42-6, Caverna 23-22, Eminence 34-13 and Ludlow 35-13

**Volleyball:** Coach Pennie Wiseman's varsity team ran their season record to 17-7 on the season after reaching the semifinals of the Bath County Invitational. They won their second consecutive 10<sup>th</sup> Region Touchstone All "A" Championship and finished 3<sup>rd</sup> Place at the State All "A" Championships.

**Boys Golf:** The boys varsity golf team won the 10<sup>th</sup> Region Touchstone All "A" Region Championship beating second place Paris. The Mustangs played in the All "A" State Tournament in Richmond September 11. They recently participated in the All "A" Region and KHSAA Regional.

**Girls Golf:** The girls varsity golf team also qualified for the Touchstone All "A" State as 10<sup>th</sup> Region Champions. The Lady 'Stangs advanced as a team to play in Richmond, Ky. Lauren Seiter was medalist for the girls tournament. They also recently finished play in the NKAC and Regional Tournaments.

**Boys Soccer:** The boys varsity won the Scott Christian Memorial Tournament They sport a season record of 10-6-2 and are heading into District Tournament play beginning October 11.

**Girls Soccer:** The girls varsity is currently 5-8-2 on the season and will begin District Tournament Play beginning October 12.

**Girls Cross Country:** The varsity girls cross country team is getting some outstanding performances from some of their younger performers and hope to be in the running for a state berth.

**Boys Cross Country:** The team has ran a very competitive schedule, racing in Louisville against some of the toughest competition in the state at the St. Xavier and Trinity meets. The varsity team won the Campbell County Championship meet and placed 2nd in the Ryle Invitational and 3rd at the Grant County Invitational.

We are currently ranked #3 in the State in Class A. Senior Zac Holtkamp is ranked 4th as an individual in the State in Class A and Senior Jack Foster is ranked 8th. Holtkamp won the Grant Co. and Ryle Invitational and Foster was 3rd and 7th respectively.
